Passing of Art Neumann

Art Neumann, the last of the original founders of Trout Unlimited, passed away March 22A.

Those of us who answered the call of conservation, can quote Leopold, Pinchot, Carson, and any other number of other conservation visionaries. Lesser known is the legacy of Art Neumann.

Art wasn't much for the catchy quote, though his adage, "take care of the fish and the fishing will take care of itself," guides Trout Unlimited a half century later. What Art did was to build an institution--an institution that began with him and a handful of other people along the banks of the Au Sable River, who were tired of the state's masking habitat degradation through stocking.

Today, the "house that Art built" includes 400 chapters, over 155,000 members, and 240 scientists, biologists, and other professional staff who serve to make fishing, and the places that fish live, better.

A month or so ago, I saw Art in Michigan with, Chris Radke and Howard Johnson. Chris and Howard represent the thousands of people in Michigan and around the country who will tirelessly carry on Art's legacy in service to the rivers, fish, anglers, kids, veterans, and communities that define our great nation. Thanks and rest in peace, Art.



Catskill Fly Fishing Museum Tree Planting

To the Chapter, below is a note from Tracy Brown, TU National Northeast Restoration Coordinator. As you may know, our chapter volunteers were involved in a project at the Catskill Fly Fishing Center and Museum, to restore the Museum casting pond and return the Willowemoc Creek to its original channel. The project was completed last year, and now needs to be planted.

A date has been set as Sunday, May 1, at 11 am. I plan on being there. There will be activists from the Museum and other chapters - Beamoc, Upper Delaware, NY City, Dave Brandt, and possibly others. This a good opportunity to meet, and hopefully fish with, members of other chapters. It is anticipated the planting will be finished 2-3 pm, and we should be able to fish after. There may be other chapter members who might be interested.

Fly of the Month: 17 Year Cicada by Jim Misiura

Although there are several broods of Cicada's which means you may see them every few years instead of once every 17 this year's hatch is expected to be quite large. The last time this brood hatched it provided some excellent action for those who were prepared. Once soil temperature hits 64 degrees hatching begins. As of this writing my garden soil sits in the low 50's so we have a bit of wait. Plenty of time to gather the materials and some extra heavy tippett to battle the big ones during this hatch. Great bass and panfish action can be had as well. Although there are a lot of patterns out there we'll showcase a beginners pattern on youtube.com at the following link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8400oZgXnoA – Hook: 2x - 3x long size 1 - 6; Thread: orange; Body: brown chenille; Rib: red cactus chenille; Back: dark tan foam; Eyes: black plastic eyes; Wings: yellow bucktail or light elk; Legs: orange crazy legs. Take a look at the video and follow along there as trying to explain it here is a bit confusing. Give it a good plop and hang on!
