#### **Clearwater Chapter**



# Fly of the Month - Ice Cream Cone

I came across this article on winter fly fishing, http://www.
gameandfishmag.com/fishing/the-best-winter-trout-flies/ and upon reading it noticed a this month's fly of

the month mentioned. Not familiar with

it I did a bit of research and came up with this link.

http://flyrodreel.com/ice-creamcone-chironomid-2/ which explains how to tie it. Winter fishing isn't for everyone and as I write this the snow is coming down hard, but a couple of hours on a mild winter day makes the long dark days go by a bit faster. Hook: 10-16 curved shank hook; Thread: 6/0 black; Body: 6/0 thread, Super Floss, Stretch Flex, Scud Back to match pupal color; Rib: red, silver, gold, dull copper; Head: white bead. Add the bead and then mount the hook. Tie in the thread and add the wire. Then form the body to a point just behind bead. Wrap the rib and tie off with enough thread to keep the bead in place. Fish deep and slow and pay attention to the subtle strikes.
